

# Ribbon Weave Quilt Pattern

42" finished size

## Fabric requirements

- Choose Twelve (12) patterned bright fabrics and cut the following from each
  - Three (3) 4" square
  - Three (3) 4" x 7½" rectangle
- Thirty Six (36) 4" squares of light fabric

Use ¼" seam allowance throughout  
RST = Right Sides together

For each block you will need 4 light fabric squares plus 1 square and 1 rectangle of 4 different bright fabrics. Sort the bright fabrics into 3 groups of 4 contrasting fabrics, and in their groups label them A to D

Sort the pieces into the following piles for each block. You will have 3 piles of each of the colour groups.

- Group 1 - One light square, one A square, One B rectangle
- Group 2 - One light square, one B square, One D rectangle
- Group 3 - One light square, one C square, One A rectangle
- Group 4 - One light square, one D square, One C rectangle



Each block is made up of 4 simple smaller blocks:

Take a light and bright square from Group 1 and place RST. Sew together on one side. Open out and press seam to the bright fabric. Repeat for Group 2 to 4.


Take the Group 1 unit and place it on top of the Group 1 rectangle RST, as shown with the light square at the top. Stitch down the right hand long edge. Open and press to the rectangle fabric side.

Repeat for Group 2 and 4.

You will now have 4 units as shown below. Rotate the blocks as shown and sew unit 1 to unit 2, unit 3 to unit 4, and then sew 1/2 to 3/4. this will make one block.



Repeat for the remaining 8 sets of fabric pieces to make 9 blocks in total.



Lay the blocks out in a 9 by 9 grid, so that the different colour blocks are evenly distributed.

Sew the blocks into rows and then sew the rows together.

Layer, baste, quilt and bind as desired.

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
