

## Supersized Star Quilt Pattern

Finished Quilt size 36½" square

### Fabric requirements:

- Four (4) x 8½" squares for corners in light/pale fabric
- Six (6) x 8 7/8" squares in bright/dark fabric
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- Sixteen (16) x 2½" x 8½" rectangles of bright/dark fabric
- Four (4) x 2½" squares for small border corners of bright/dark fabric

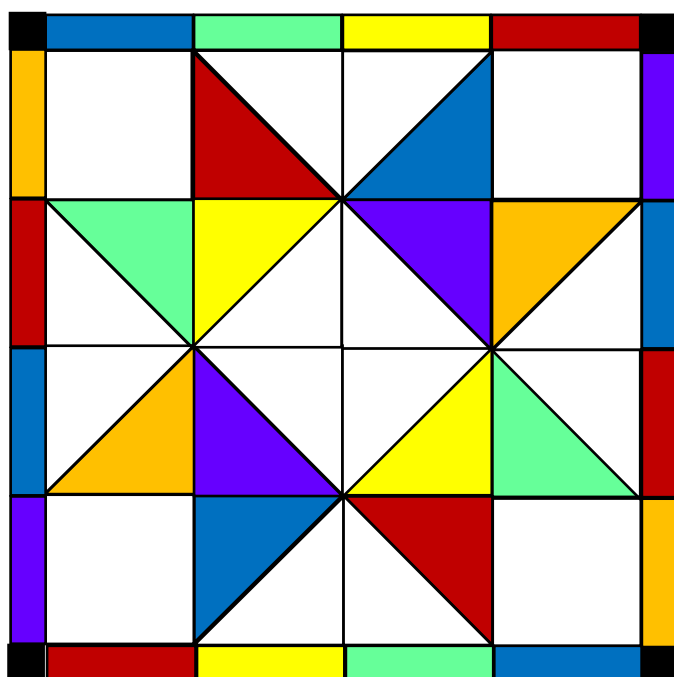
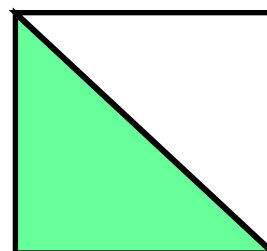
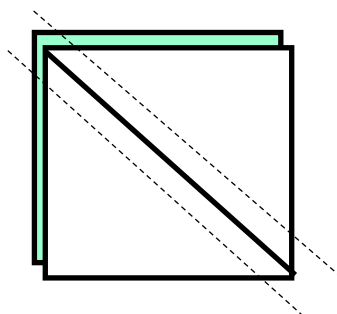
Use ¼" seam allowance throughout

Pair up the light and dark 8 7/8" squares.

For each pair, place right sides (RS) together  
Draw a line diagonally on the light square.  
Stitch a scant ¼" either side of the drawn line.

Cut on the drawn diagonal line and press the pieces open, seams towards the dark side. You will have 12 half square triangle (HST) units that measure 8½" square.

Arrange the HST units and corner squares as shown below.  
Sew together into 4 rows.  
Then sew the rows together.



Take the Sixteen 2½" by 8½" squares and sort them into groups of 4.

Sew each set of 4 end to end in to a long strip. Sew a 2½" square to each end of two of these strips.

These strips make up the borders.

Sew the two shorter borders to the sides, then the longer ones to the top and bottom.
